UiTM INTERNATIONAL SPORTS FIESTA RULES AND REGULATIONS TABLE TENNIS

### 1.0 Rules of Competition

This match is run according to International Table Tennis Federal Law and general rules.

### 2.0 Eligibility

This tournament is by INVITATION ONLY.
2.1. STUDENTS of UNIVERSITIES.
2.2. Each team may nominate up to 11 players and 2 team officials from the same university and college.
2.3. Each university may register a maximum of two (2) teams.

### 3.0 Type of Match

Match run as a team event.

### 4.0 Competition Format

4.1 The team competition
4.1.1 Each team consists of 11 players representing 6 male players and 5 female players.
4.1.2 A player is allowed to play in one event only.
4.1.3 The match's structure is as follows:
4.1.3.1 Men's singles
4.1.3.2 Women's singles
4.1.3.3 Men's double first
4.1.3.4 Women's doubles
4.1.3.5 Mixed doubles
4.1.4 The list of names in order matches shall be communicated to the Honorary Referee 15 minutes before the match started.

* Any replacement is not allowed after the game started.


### 5.0 Equipment

Ball games and sports equipment prescribed by the Technical Committee will be provided by the Organizing Committee.

### 6.0 Competition System

6.1 Games will be played in the system "Best of 5".

### 7.0 How to Decide On the Group's Results

7.1 How to give points:

7.2 If two teams have the same number of points, the team that beats his opponent wins.
7.3 If three or more teams have the same number of points, then the decision will be determined as follows:
7.3.1 $\quad$ The team that wins the most matches wins.
7.3.2 If still a tie, the team that won the most number of games (sets), isdeclared the winner.
7.3.3 If still a tie, the team with the most games the difference calculated to win.
7.3.4 If still a tie, the team with the highest number of points in the game calculated to win.
7.3.5 If still a tie, the team that has defeated his opponent calculated wins.

### 8.0 Indemnity

The organizing Committee and its appointed officials shall not be held responsible for any chronic injuries of mishaps that may occur during the UiTM International Sports Fiesta or as a result of participation in the Games.

### 9.0 Protest

9.1 All protest must be submitted with RM500.00 (Ringgit Malaysia: FIVE HUNDRED ONLY) as a deposit. If the protest is not accepted, the deposit willnot be returned.
9.2 A protest must be submitted within 30 minutes after the match ended.

### 10.0 Clothes

Clothing appropriate to the game of Table Tennis. Participants are not allowed to wear the orange / yellow jersey.

### 11.0 Prizes

The prizes for the UiTM International Sports Fiesta will be provided, by the Organizing Committee, for the champion and the runners up of the cup and plate categories. Certificates of participation will be presented to all participants and officials of the Games.

### 12.0 Self-Reporting

All players must report himself to the Honorary Referee after his name was announced to play.

### 13.0 Delays

A grace period of 5 minutes is given to the player who is late and after the 5 minutes is up the opponent will be awarded a walkover by a count, 11-0, 11-0, 11-0.

### 14.0 Others Matter

In all others matter not covered by the preceding rules, the decision of the Organizing Committee shall be final.

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
